
## **Block 10: June**

If you have been cutting up all your scraps, you have probably reached a point where you mostly have pieces less than 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  inches wide. This month our star will be a great way to use those smaller scraps, though it goes together quickly.

## **Cutting for one block:**



For each of the four star points, cut one 4 ½ by 1 ½ inch rectangle and one 1 ½ inch square. These may be four different colors, or two of each of two colors, or all four the same color. My sample is two each of two colors, so I cut 2 red rectangles and 2 red squares, and 2 blue rectangles and 2 blue squares.

From the background fabric, cut four 3  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch squares, four 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch rectangles and eight 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch squares.

**Border:** Cut four 2  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 10  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch rectangles.

## Assembly:

**1.Draw** a diagonal line across all eight 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch squares. Position on the 4  $\frac{1}{2}$  x 1  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch rectangles as shown in the diagram. Sew on the line, trim a quarter inch away and press in either direction or open. Be sure yours look like this:






2.Sew the red and blue squares to the ends of 2  $\frac{1}{2} \times 1 \frac{1}{2}$  rectangles.



3. Assemble the parts: Sew the previous step to the 3  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch squares like this.



4. Then sew these to the trapezoids.



5. Rotate the pieces and sew the four-patch together. It should measure 8  $\frac{1}{2}$  inches square.



6. Finally sew the 4 border pieces on.



If you make three of these just like the other months, at the end of the BOM, you will have a total of 30 blocks to make into a QOV. Or, if you like making this block, make lots.
